## What Are the Eligibility Requirements for MassHealth/Medicaid Long-Term Care Benefits?

MassHealth reviews all financial transactions made within the five years preceding the application. Any transfers of assets for less than fair market value may result in penalties, delaying eligibility for benefits.

- Financial statements for the past five years.
- Proof of income and assets.

- Medical records demonstrating the need for nursing home care.
